The Functioning Scale is comprised of 20 items designed to rate the youths level of functioning in areas of daily activity. (e.g., interpersonal relationships, recreation, self direction, and motivation). Each item is rated on a 5 point scale (0 "extreme troubles" to 4 "Doing very well"). The average looks at the youth, parent/caregiver and staff viewpoints.

A score below 50 is a clinically significant score. A change (increase) A score above 25 is a clinically significant score. A change in 8 points is considered significant.

The Symptom/Problem Severity Scale is comprised of 20 items covering problems reported by youth who receive behavioral health services. Each item is rated for severity/frequency (0 "Not at All" to 5 "All the time") on a six point scale. The average looks at the youth, parent/caregiver and staff viewpoints.
